Dundee Social and Recreation Club Inc invite all members and the general public to join the Bynoe Harbour Queens Birthday Camp Out Fishing and Crabbing Competition to be held at Lot 24 Roberts Road Bynoe Haven Estate Milne (*follow the signs from the Sandpalms Roadhouse*). Fishing and crabbing can take place in the Bynoe Harbour as far as Indian Island and at the fresh water Finnis.

WEIGH IN Saturday	6 pm to 7pm
WEIGH IN Sunday	5pm to 6pm (scales down at 6pm sharp)
PRESENTATIONS	Sunday night

- All boats are to sign the daily boat OUT / boat IN white board.
- Only two (2) fish per species per angler per day can be weighed in for all prize pools.
- All fish to be weighed in an EDIBLE condition and must exceed 400mm except Barramundi which must exceed 550mm.
- All fish are to be GUTTED & GILLED except for potential record claim fish.
- The actual captor must weigh in the fish.
- No sharks rays catfish or eels to be weighed in
- No snapper winches permitted.
- The Dundee Social and Recreation Club committee decisions are final.
- Each competitor is required to complete a registration form and pay the applicable fee. Juniors 16 and under are encouraged to enter the event.

Prizes are awarded to Adult and Junior competitors for the heaviest fish caught over the two day event from the following species. A surprise mystery weight will also be awarded.

Prizes are also awarded for the **heaviest mud crab** weighed in overall.
